MADHYA PRADESH, INDIA MRIDA EDUCATION AND WELFARE SOCIETY

On the evening of 24 March 2020, the <u>Government of India</u> ordered a nationwide <u>lockdown</u> for 21 days, limiting the movement of the entire 1.38 billion (138 <u>crores</u>) population of <u>India</u> as a preventive measure against the <u>COVID-19 pandemic in India</u>





Riverside Natural School (RNS) was closed when the lockdown was announced. All the schoolchildren were sent back home. With the change in landscape, we faced new hurdles. We kept in touch with the children. Team Mrida made sure to send food when their home ration ran out or when the government supplies could not reach them. We sent transport to ferry the sick children and their family members for treatment at the Community Health Centre and the well-equipped hospital in Mandla.



We adopted technology to continue teaching our school children who had to go back home to their villages during the pandemic. But the struggle for many of our school children was access to technology itself. It was a huge challenge for us to keep up the momentum of studies going via remote learning in rural areas, especially for high schoolers.

Some of the challenges faced by our schools are :

- Only 265 children of the total of 550+ from Grade 9 to Grade 12 in the Mohgaon Government high school had mobile access. And a mere 50 out of these 265 children would respond daily on an average on the WhatsApp group.
- Only 77 students of the 158 pre-schoolers of RNS had access to study material on WhatsApp. And. we could not verify the accessibility to studies for these 51 preschool students.

The student engagement numbers were really disheartening. But we put in extra efforts to reach out to our students.

- We sent worksheets and textbooks to children in their villages along with the concerned teacher's phone number.
- Children were encouraged to complete the school assignments and submit and call the teacher, in case of any questions.
- Our teachers created audio content in the local language (stories) for preschoolers and early primary classes.
- All the high schoolers got lots of projects to keep them occupied with studies.
- We also distributed 1 sweater and 2 t-shirts to every child from the community shelter home from the donation funds.



All children had to take up at least 1 life skill project, where they learned to make things of utility like bamboo articles, pickles, jams, hand wash, neem oil, and many different things by using locally available materials. They also learned to document the entire process.

COVID RELIEF PROJECT

- Tele- consultation with Medcords (telemedicine service provider) doctors to patients via a smartphone.
- Implement COVID protocol for those suspected COVID positive patients.
- Provide prescribed medicines as per the AIIMS protocol to the patients.
- Manage a set per village volunteer teams of pulse oximeter and thermometer to be used as needed.
- Provide a sanitizer, surgical gloves and the N95 masks to volunteers working on the field.
- Door to door visits by our volunteers in the selected villages to gauge medical treatment needed
- in respective homes.
- Provide information on proven household remedies that can help relieve symptoms.
- Vehicle on call to transport emergency cases to the nearest health center/hospital per availability.





PROJECTS UNDERTAKEN



RAJA HRIDAY SHAH GOLDEN BABY LEAGUE - OUR SPORTS INITIATIVE

- We started the Golden Baby League, this year to address the problem of lack of learning opportunities for students. Under the league, football matches were held between different village teams every Sunday in the U10 and U13 age groups. There are no spectators for these matches, and they are entirely organized, managed, and run by the children and staff of RNS and Mrida.
- All matches were held in strict compliance with COVID guidelines and are approved by AIFF. So far, we have conducted 30 matches over 4 Sundays with 100 more to go.



KHETI SHIKSHA KE LIYE - OUR SUSTAINABILITY INITIATIVE

- We have been ideating on a self-sustainable model to raise finances for Mrida's development programs for some time now. For that, we plan to leverage our deep ties with the local Adivasi farmers whose children study at RNS to cultivate medicinal plants and food forests on lands that have been lying fallow for many years. This year, along with 18 farmers, we are cultivating 40 acres (out of the > 1400 acres of land) to grow the medicinal crop of Ashwagandha.
- This initiative has created opportunities for labor work in the 5 villages and has helped farmers effectively utilize an otherwise idle resource (unused land). The farmers and their families too. work on the land as a contribution towards the education of their children. We plan to use 60% of the harvest net of costs to help support Mrida's work and the rest will be paid to the farmers. Through such community participation models, we aim to generate 100% of the financial resources for our education and sports programs in the future. Till then, we continue to rely on our generous donors' and patron's support to sustain our innovative onthe-ground development programs.





FUNDING UPDATE

We raised a total of Rs. 56.04 lakh, significantly lower than the Rs. 1.28 crore that we raised in 2019-20 thanks to COVID-19. While we were shut during the initial 3 months, we re-opened the hostel with a limited number of students soon after so we could provide a safe and hygienic place to our children. We made salary cuts but laid off nobody to ensure that one of our staff members continued to be supported. This was important as some of them come from poor families as well and need the support that a stable income from Mrida gives them. Our key donors were Give Foundation, Awlencann India (ZebPay) and many other individuals who have been important pillars supporting our work all these years.
